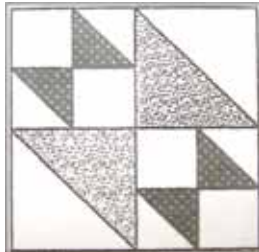


**FGQG 25th Anniversary Block Party “Block of the Month”  
 “Bridesmaid’s Puzzle,” Blocks due July 12, 2010**

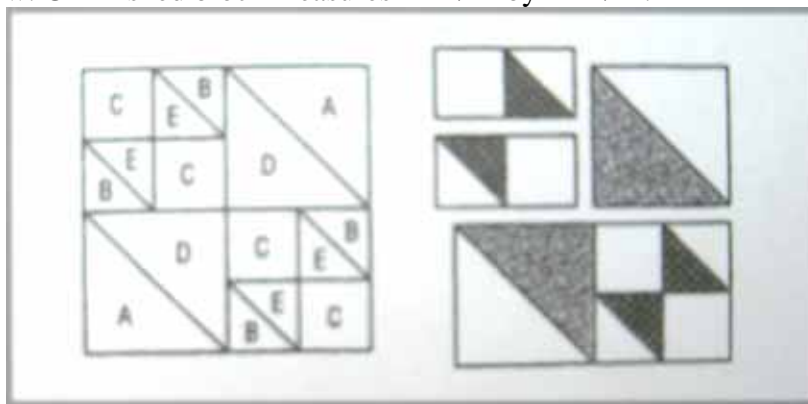


Here’s an old pattern, using six half square triangle blocks; four squares; and, three different fabrics. Directions for making half square triangles can be found on the FGQG Web site. Some prefer to cut the half squares slightly larger, to allow for sewing errors. Then, “true up” the squares after sewing by measuring the blocks and rotary cutting exactly to size.

<u>PIECE</u>	<u>FABRIC</u>	<u># TO CUT</u>	<u>SIZE</u>
A	light	1	7” by 7” squares (or, use 6-7/8”) The smaller
B	light	2	4” by 4” squares (or, use 3-7/8”) measurement
C	light	4	3-1/2” by 3-1/2” squares saves a bit
D	medium	1	7” by 7” squares (or, use 6-7/8”) of fabric.
E	dark	2	4” by 4” squares (or, use 3-7/8”)

- ★ Make dark and light half square triangle blocks from **A** and **D** squares. “True up” (measure and trim) the half squares to 6-1/2” by 6-1/2”.
- ★ Make dark and light half square triangle blocks from **B** and **E** squares. “True up” (measure and trim) the half squares to 3-1/2” by 3-1/2”.

All seams are 1/4”. Press toward the darker fabrics, and sew the block according to the diagram below. Unfinished block measures 12-1/2” by 12-1/2”.




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Make one to four blocks, For each block, you will be given one chance to win a set of blocks. One or more names will be drawn, and the blocks distributed among one or more people. If the total is not equal, the last name drawn may receive fewer blocks.
